Export Compliance Acknowledgment Form

1. I understand that, as a member of the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Consortium (CWMD Consortium), my organization may be granted access to information that may be subject to one or more export control laws and regulations of the U.S. Government and that the information may fall under the control/ jurisdiction of either the Department of State or the Department of Commerce.
